
Email address on GO

Please can you ensure the email address you have on GO is an email that you check regularly or please ensure you check this email address on a regular basis. Peer Education

If you're looking for something a bit different, how about inviting a Peer Educator to your unit, either face to face or virtually? Peer Educators are young members aged between 14 and 26 who are qualified to run sessions for Brownies, Guides and Rangers. These sessions are called Think Resilient (on mental wellbeing), Breaking Free (on gender stereotypes) and Free Being Me (on body confidence) and are tailored specifically for your unit. Each of these sessions come with a badge that can be bought from the Girlguiding website or can be found in the Girlguiding catalogue. Spotlight on.... Tally Costello



Hi! My name is Tally, and I'm the new Peer Education county coordinator!

My guiding journey began in Scarborough West Division, being part of 1st Forge Valley Rainbows, 1st Brompton with Snainton Brownies, 1st Forge Valley Guides, where I also became a young leader, and West Division Senior Section member. It is without a doubt my time at these units and the enjoyment I had there is the reason that I am still in Guiding today.

After moving to Edinburgh to university, I became a guide leader there too. I was part of a wonderful unit for three years, which grew from 10 girls to 45 in the

time I was there (including one September where 20 guides joined at the same time!). I am now training to be a maths teacher and living in Leeds and am part of a lovely guide unit there now - I have only met them in person a handful of times so I look forward to meeting them properly in the future.

While I was a student I came across a training to become a Peer Educator. Peer Educators are young members of Girlguiding aged between 14 and 25 who run sessions for Brownies, Guides and Rangers on current issues. Despite being in the middle of my first year exams I decided to go for it, which turned out to be an amazing decision! Since training nearly three years ago I have helped run 74 sessions, the majority of which (52 I think!) were done virtually over lockdown. The opportunity to run sessions over lockdown has been beneficial not just for me as it has kept me very busy, but also for the people I've run the sessions for. The sessions are tailored to the girls' needs and are on issues relating to young girls today: mental wellbeing (Think Resilient), gender stereotypes (Breaking Free) and body confidence (Free Being Me). Running sessions virtually also means that we can run sessions for more people, some of whom wouldn't necessarily be able to access a peer educator in person, which means it is easier than ever to have a Peer Educator at your unit. There are also badges for completing each session, which is a bonus, and can be bought from any depot or the Girlguiding website.

My aim in my new role is to raise awareness of what peer education is and the benefits it can have for you and your unit, as well as recruiting more girls to train when in-person training can run again.
