A Safe Space Level 3 Training - message from region

We've recently launched virtual L3 training dates up to the middle of September which you can book online. We're aware that there are a significant number of volunteers coming up for renewal in September, and we anticipate that September demand will be greater than the number of places we can offer in that month. What we need to prevent this becoming a problem and stopping units meeting in the new school year is for volunteers to plan and book their training now, checking out the course dates which are available from May all through the summer term and holidays.

Family Camping at Barneybeck

NYNE has a campsite at Redmire in lovely Wensleydale and as camping with our girls is not possible this year Barneybeck is available for family camps.

- Each family must belong to a NYNE leader who must be with the group.
- ❖ The fee will be £3.00 per person per night for use of a campsite, a toilet/shower block and access to the large barn for fridge/freezers and emergency dry shelter in case of really bad weather.
- You will need to bring all your own equipment.
- To comply with Covid-19 regulations only two family camps can be accommodated at a time.
- Thorough cleaning of the toilet/shower block must be carried out before leaving Barneybeck. Materials are provided.
- All rubbish must be taken home with you.

Email Address on GO

Please can you ensure the email address you have on GO is an email that you check regularly or please ensure you check this email address on a regular basis. Email is the way Girlguiding contact leaders when their Safe Space training is due, DBS is due to be renewed etc so it is important to check this email so these important requirements are not overlooked.

Updating GO with "current offer"

Please can units look at their unit on GO and update the new current offer tab which you will find at the top of the page where you find the tabs for programme, individuals etc. This is giving you the opportunity to list what offers you are currently offering in your unit. You will just need to update it as and when things change.

Peer Education

If you're looking for something a bit different, how about inviting a Peer Educator to your unit, either face to face or virtually? Peer Educators are young members aged between 14 and 26 who are qualified to run sessions for Brownies, Guides and Rangers. These sessions are called Think Resilient (on mental wellbeing), Breaking Free (on gender stereotypes) and Free Being Me (on body confidence) and are tailored specifically for your unit. Each of these sessions come with a badge that can be bought from the Girlguiding website or can be found in the Girlguiding catalogue. Inspire Toolkit updates

We have retired the region Inspire toolkit developed in 2019 from the region website as we have been sent some updated resources from HQ. Key points to note: There are now 2 separate toolkits:

- Supporting and Promoting Girlguiding Inspire
 - this is intended to be a key document for commissioners and chiefs, with constructive actions that they can take, support or implement. It can also be a resource for coordinators, Ranger leaders, county or division teams, or other members who are looking for further information on how to plan to include and support the Inspire community.
 - The toolkit covers:
 Getting Inspire off the ground, member engagement, growth & retention, promoting Inspire, and statistics on our 18-30 members. As well as the content in the 'An Introduction to...' toolkit.
- An Introduction to Girlguiding Inspire
 - this is aimed at anyone who wants to find out more including Inspire members, Ranger leaders, people outside of or new to Girlguiding. It is also a resource to answer FAQs.
 - The toolkit covers:
 Formation of Inspire and development of the name, introduction to Inspire themes and pathways, transition from Rangers to Inspire, starting local Inspire groups, Event ideas and suggestions of badges to do with a group of adults, National monthly themes for 2021
